ELCJHL Bishop Dr. Sani-Ibrahim Azar, recently shared an update with the ELCIC on the escalating violence in the West Bank and the impact of the war on the church. In his letter he noted: due to the increase in violence, schools have had to close; checkpoints between the West Bank and Jerusalem have been nearly completely closed off preventing many people in these communities from being able to travel to and from work; and there has been a devastating impact on families livelihoods.
