When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

'Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

'Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

'Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

MEDITATION

Music – I love music, not just listening to it but I love being part of it ... in the choir. I have been a member of choirs my whole. Singing a part in the choir, accompanying the choir, ringing bells in the choir. Music, for me, has been about being part of a community

All saints is about being children of God ...a community of faith ... you could say it is like being in the choir ... not sitting on the sideline watching others but actively being

part of the community. And in this choir that is a community of faith there are a multitude members. Some of the choir members are still beside me, but some are missing. Their voices missing, but not really – they are still with me, part of me, the blessing they brought to life is still very real to me.

Who are the blessed members of the choir? There are the big names: Abraham & Sarah, Isaac & Rebekah, Jacob & Leah & Rachel; Joseph; Moses & Aaron & Miriam, Joshua & Rahab; Samuel & David, the prophets, the 12 disciples of Jesus, Mary & Joseph.

But there are also all the other members of the choir ... the Sunday school teachers, the parents, the encouragers, all of you

And Jesus talks about being members of the choir in a different way: The blessed choir! And this is not a choir of headliners.

Poor in spirit; the mourners, the meek, those who try desperately to do the right thing. The ones who are either overlooked or seen as soft: the ones who forgive, who always look for the good in others, the ones who try to get along with others.

Not the "A" team. Maybe not even the "B" team. More the kind of people who get bullied in the wide world.

That's the choir ... that's our choir. And this is not an exclusive auditioned choir. No . We are the choir of the blessed that Jesus spoke about ... We are the children of God that John talked about
