But the midwives feared God; they did not do as the king of Egypt commanded them, but they let the boys live. So the king of Egypt summoned the midwives and said to them, 'Why have you done this, and allowed the boys to live?' The midwives said to Pharaoh, 'Because the Hebrew women are not like the Egyptian women; for they are vigorous and give birth before the midwife comes to them.' So God dealt well with the midwives; and the people multiplied and became very strong.

MEDITATION

We have been following the family story – saga – of Abraham and Sarah and their offspring. Last week we left them in the care of their long lost brother Joseph. Safe in Egypt under the rule of a benevolent and appreciative Pharaoh. It seemed like a happy ending ... but today we hear that this is not so. The current Pharaoh is afraid of them – what might happen if the Hebrews turned against him?

This is the beginning of the story of Moses. Most of us have heard the story of the baby Moses in the basket many times over. But within the story about Moses there is another one about the two midwives Puah and Shiphrah and this story within a story is very special to me.

So Pharaoh, in fear, decided to disable the H through selective extermination: let the girl babies live, kill all the boy babies The midwives – Shiphrah and Puah -- were given their instructions And they ignored them......And that's how Moses came to live instead of dying at birth

Those midwives -- Shiphrah and Puah -- were dealt a pretty bad hand. They were told to do something that went against what they believed - what they were trained to do. In their line of work life is precious. A new baby was to be welcomed not killed. But they had been commanded to kill certain babies. And the command came from no less than the pharaoh. They had a real dilemma to deal with. What was the right thing to do? Being clever and wise they found a way through .. a way to be disobedient and yet faithful.

I have a personal connection with this story. Many years ago when I was expecting a baby I went to the doctor for a routine visit. The doctor could not find the baby's heart beat. This was heart breaking especially since this pregnancy was following a very brief one. The doctor said, "It's all up to God." Which I thought was stupid: God wouldn't want my baby to die ... He was a fine doctor, but not so great a theologian.

I was sent to the hospital in the city to see "what was the best course of action to deal with a baby without a heartbeat." It was very subdued as the ultrasound technician got me ready for my exam: she had the screen positioned so that I couldn't see it and the sound was turned down. I guess this was to make the situation easier for me. After a few silent moments the technician spoke: "I'm not really allowed to tell you anything [only the doctor could tell you the result of the ultrasound], <u>but</u> if you look over here," she said and then she moved the screen so I could see it and put the volume of the ultrasound up: I saw a baby swimming around and I heard the most wonderful sound in all the world - whoosh, whoosh - whoosh whoosh. She handed me a box of kleenex and said would I like my husband to come in - and this also was against the rules at that time. What a wonderful rule breaking woman.

She didn't make our baby come back to life, but she did help make a difficult situation better ... her rule breaking was very caring. To me she belonged to the same school of thought as Shiphrah and Puah: breaking or bending the rules to bring new life to birth To give **life-giving care**. Because of the two midwives Moses lived to lead the Israelites out of Egypt

At this point you might think I am telling you to be disobedient ... I have heard that there are pastors who have told their church family that they don't have to wear a mask, that it is OK to disregard the rules. LET ME BE CLEAR: wear a mask, keep all the rules that prevent the spread of covid 19: doing that is **life-giving care**.

The point I am trying to make is that it is hard to know what is the right thing to do. Every day I see people trying to make right decisions .. not always decisions as hard as the one facing Shiphrah and Puah ... but difficult nonetheless.

We are called to be midwives ... people who bring **life-giving care** ... doesn't matter what our gender is ... we are called to bring **life-giving care**. And like the midwives of long ago it is sometimes hard to make the decisions that provide **life-giving care**. When to follow the rules and when to be subversive? What is the foundation -- the rock -- on which we base those decisions?

Like Peter we believe that Jesus is the Christ, the son of the living God. We are guided in making difficult decisions by Jesus' life and teaching. What did Jesus do? How did Jesus live? What did Jesus teach us? And in the difficult dilemmas that we face we ask ourselves "is this decision one that is life-giving?" I am not saying that it is always easy. There are no easy answers to many of the dilemmas that we face from day to day. But we do know that God has promised to walk with us as we face the questions that come up along the way.

Prayer: O God let each of us in our own way become midwives so that we may bring life-giving care to our world. Guide our decisions making ... show us when to follow the rules and when to be subversive. All so that your life-giving care may be shared. This we ask in Jesus name. Amen.
