






- Today is the 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday after Pentecost.

- In Pentecost, we're reminded that God's love lasts forever!


### Whose Eyes?

#### **Bells and Whistles**








• Today is the **23**<sup>rd</sup> Sunday after Pentecost.

Can you find this tree's roots? Color them! Then color in these pictures of things that act like roots in your own life!






God's love will last forever!
