



Unscramble the letters and place them in the correct spaces to find out what the pastor says to all worshipers.













Evergreen **needles** stay green **all year long**. **Evergreen** branches make an Advent wreath. They remind us that God loves us **all the time**.

Draw ornaments on this evergreen tree to remind you to get ready for Jesus.







