One person would use a toe or sandal to trace an arch in the dust like this: The other person would respond by tracing a second arch like this:


Today people use the fish sign to show others that they are Jesus' followers.













Epiphany 5

- God shines light on us. We can shine light in the world!


Constellation Station

When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him. Luke 5:11








