





God gives us Jesus in the bread and wine we share. Draw the bread and wine on the altar.




#### How are these people inviting others? Match the invitation with the person sending it.



## Hidden Message




Memory Verse


Do you know what the word humble means? It means being modest, meek, and selfless in behavior or spirit. What are some words that mean the **opposite** of humble?
