
This week

Draw a royal crown above each of these pictures of Jesus.




Reusable Cross




Then he said, "Jesus, **remember** me when you come into your kingdom." Luke 23:42

When do we usually read the story of Jesus' death?




CHRIST THE KING

Look around your church. How can you tell people are praising Christ the King?


Circle the ways you see people worshipping.






Jesus died on the cross to show just how much he loves you.
