The voice said, "This is my Son!"

Today we remember when Jesus was **baptized**. Baptism uses **water** as a symbol of God's spirit. God claimed Jesus as his **son**.

Have you ever seen a baptism? When someone is baptized, the people in the church make a **promise**. They promise to **help** each other stay close to God. When we make the sign of the cross, we remember that God has marked all of us as his children.
