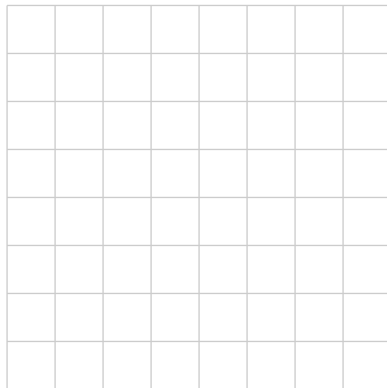
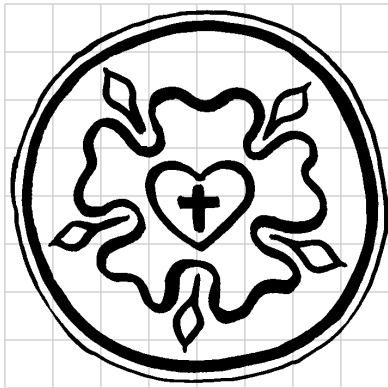

Welcome to worship. Today is Reformation Sunday. Reform means to reshape or change. A long time ago, a man named Martin Luther started some changes in the church.

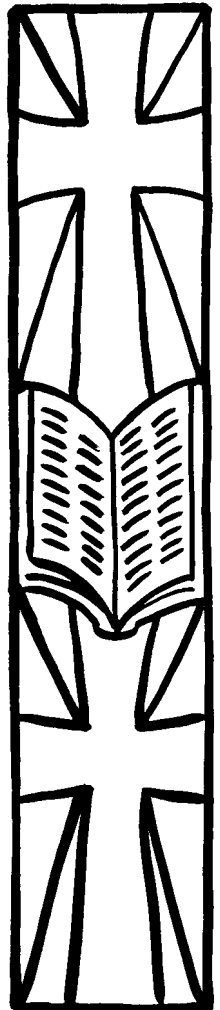
Martin Luther knew that the Bible is a wonderful gift from God. Martin Luther wanted everyone to be able to read God's word in their own language.

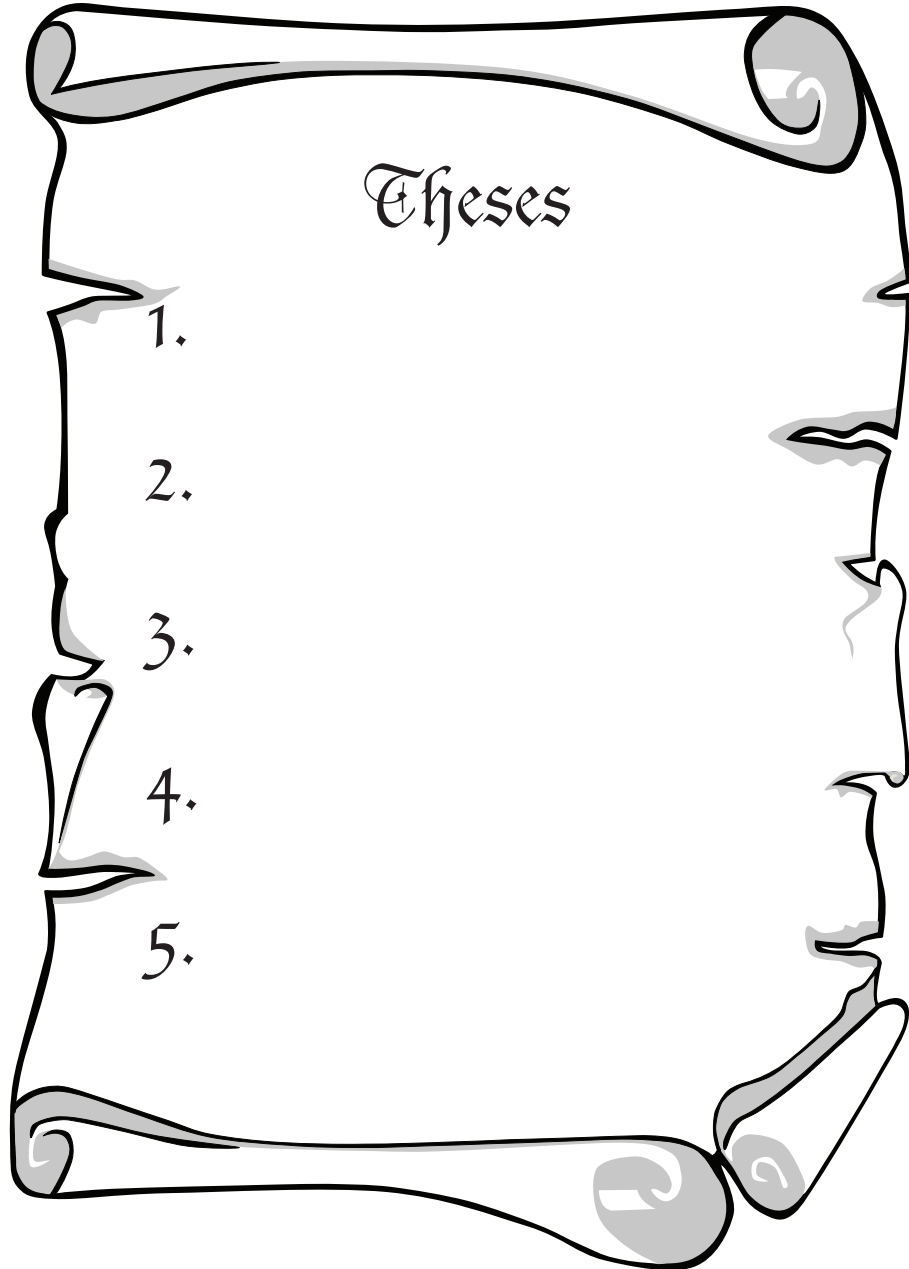
- Lutherans get their name from Martin Luther.

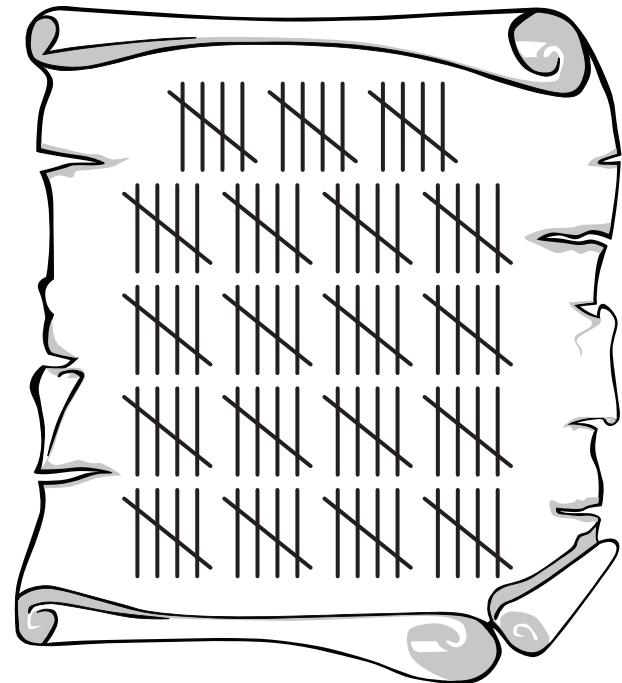

How Many Theses?

On Reformation Sunday, we celebrate October 31, 1517! That was the day that Martin Luther posted a list of theses on the door of a Catholic church in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther's theses were protests about the way the church worked at that time. He wanted to share his ideas about how to make the church better. This was a risky move, but many people say it began the Protestant Church. Can you count how many theses Martin Luther wrote and nailed to the door?

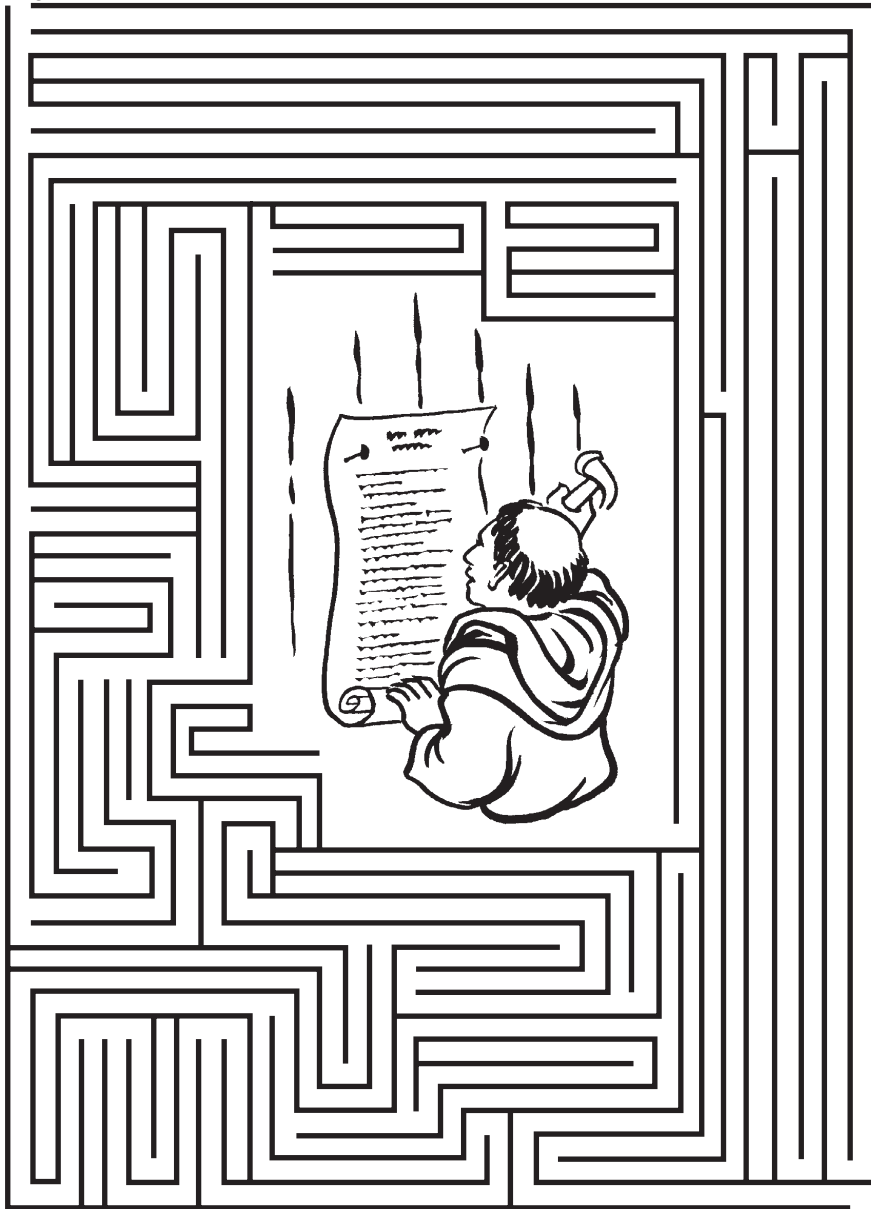

Reformation Sunday celebrates the beginning of the Protestant Church, which gave birth to the Lutheran Church. In the box is a list of statements that describe both Catholicism and Lutheranism. 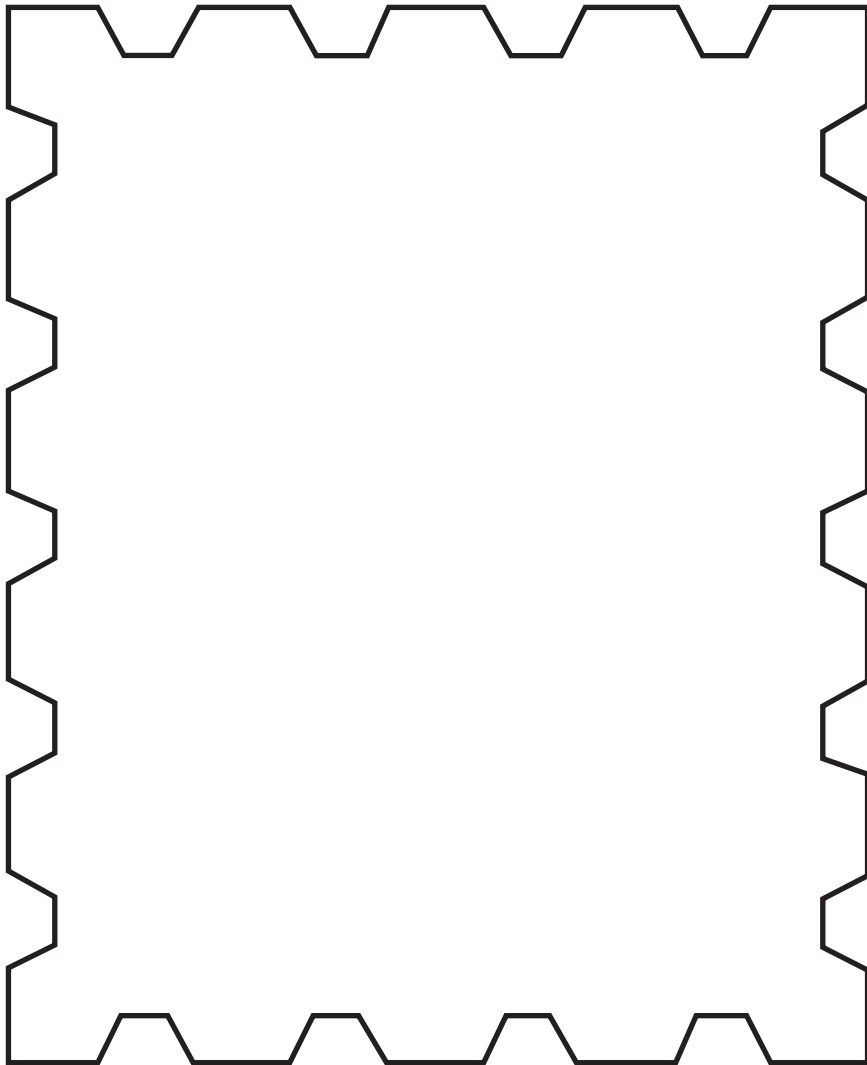
