

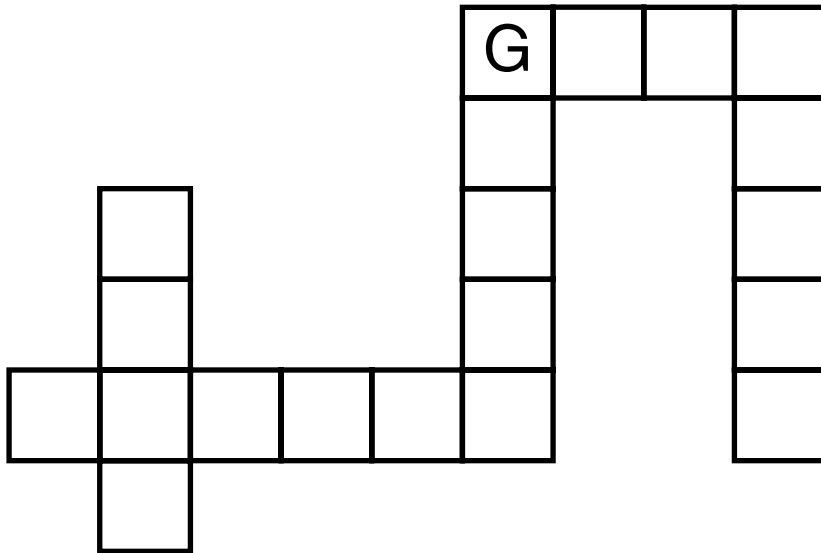

Write prayers on strips of colorful paper. Join the strips together to make a prayer chain.

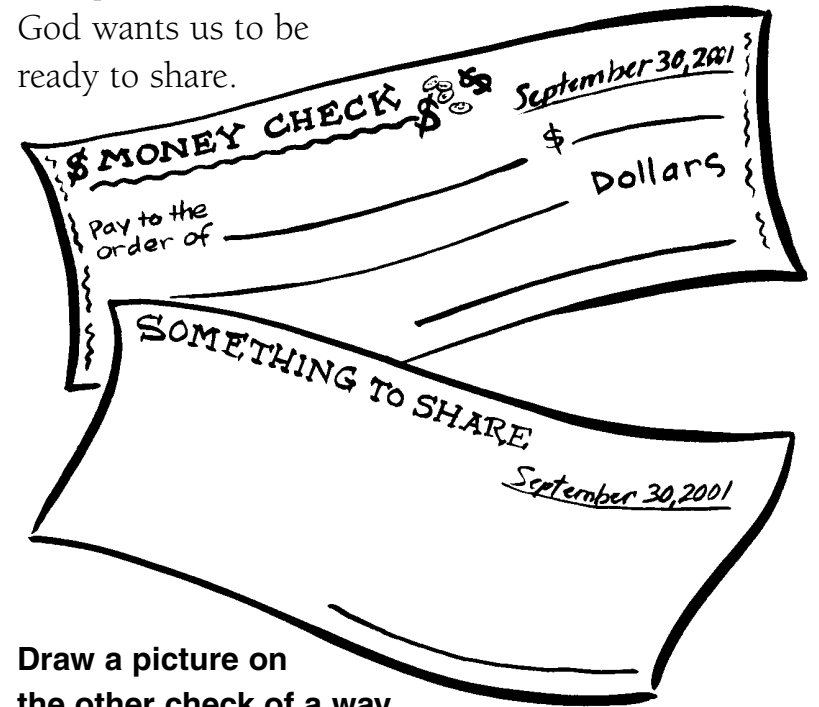

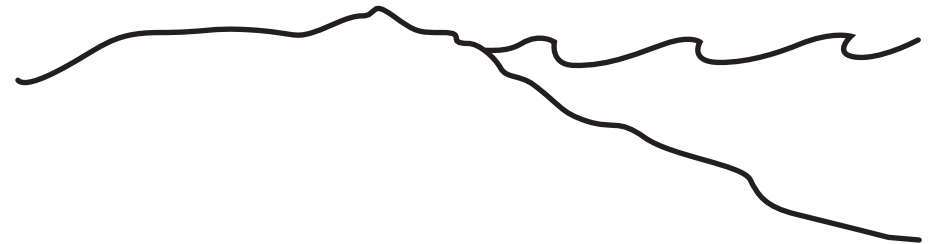

- Just as green things grow, **our faith also grows** during Pentecost!

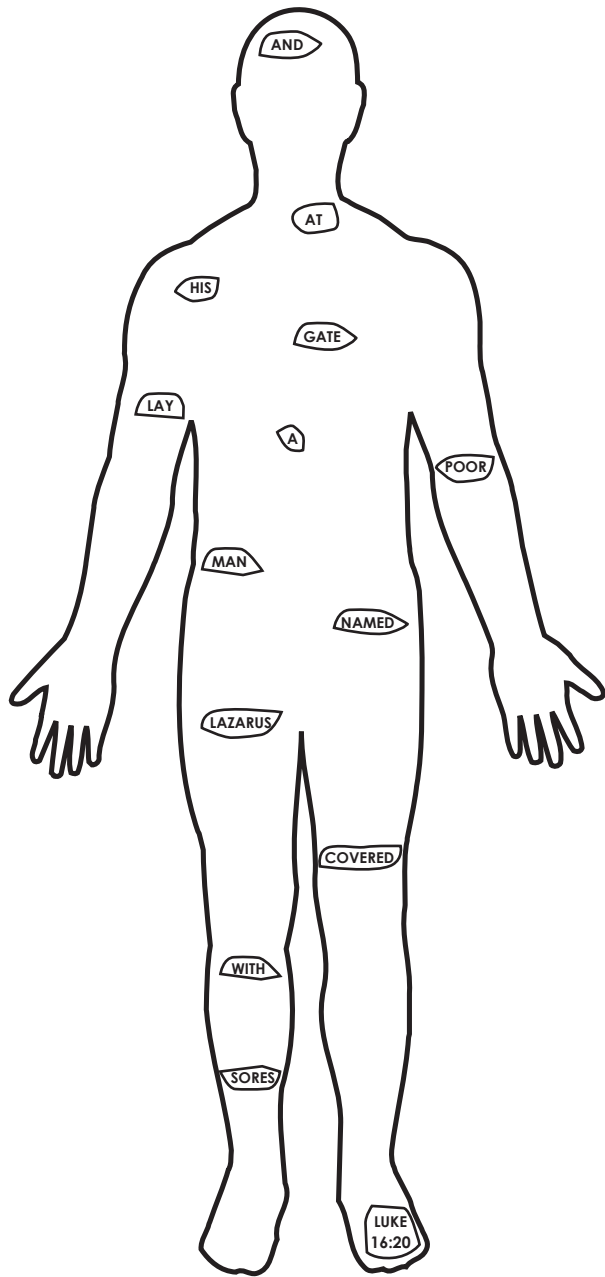
You're the Artist

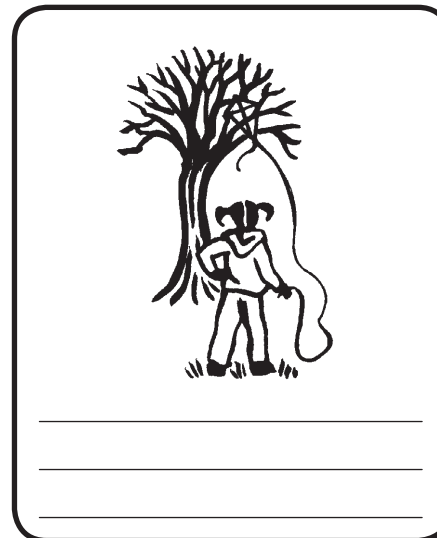
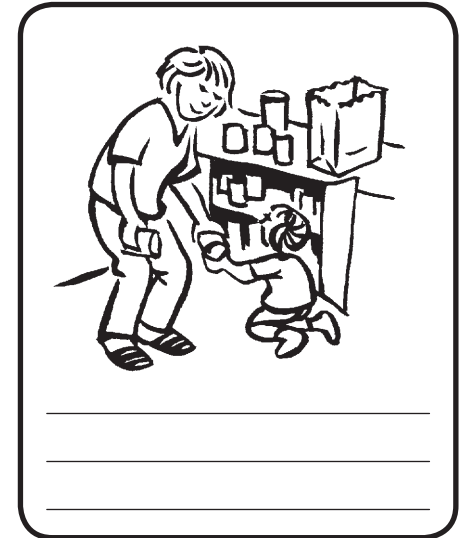
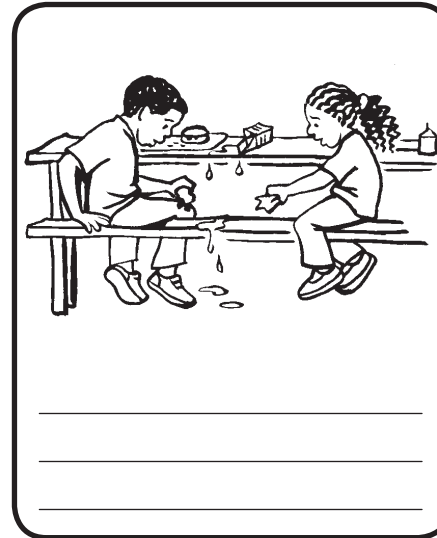


Look It Up!

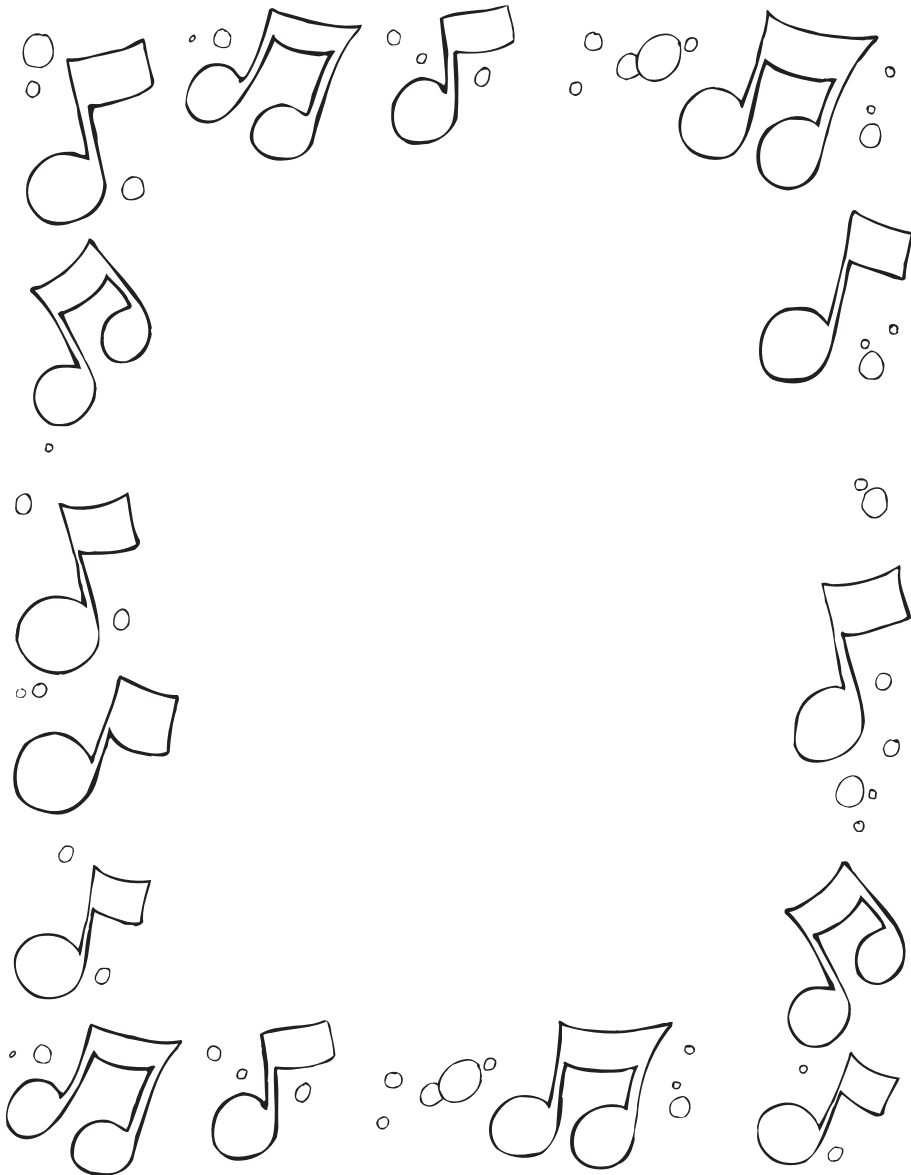
HELP!

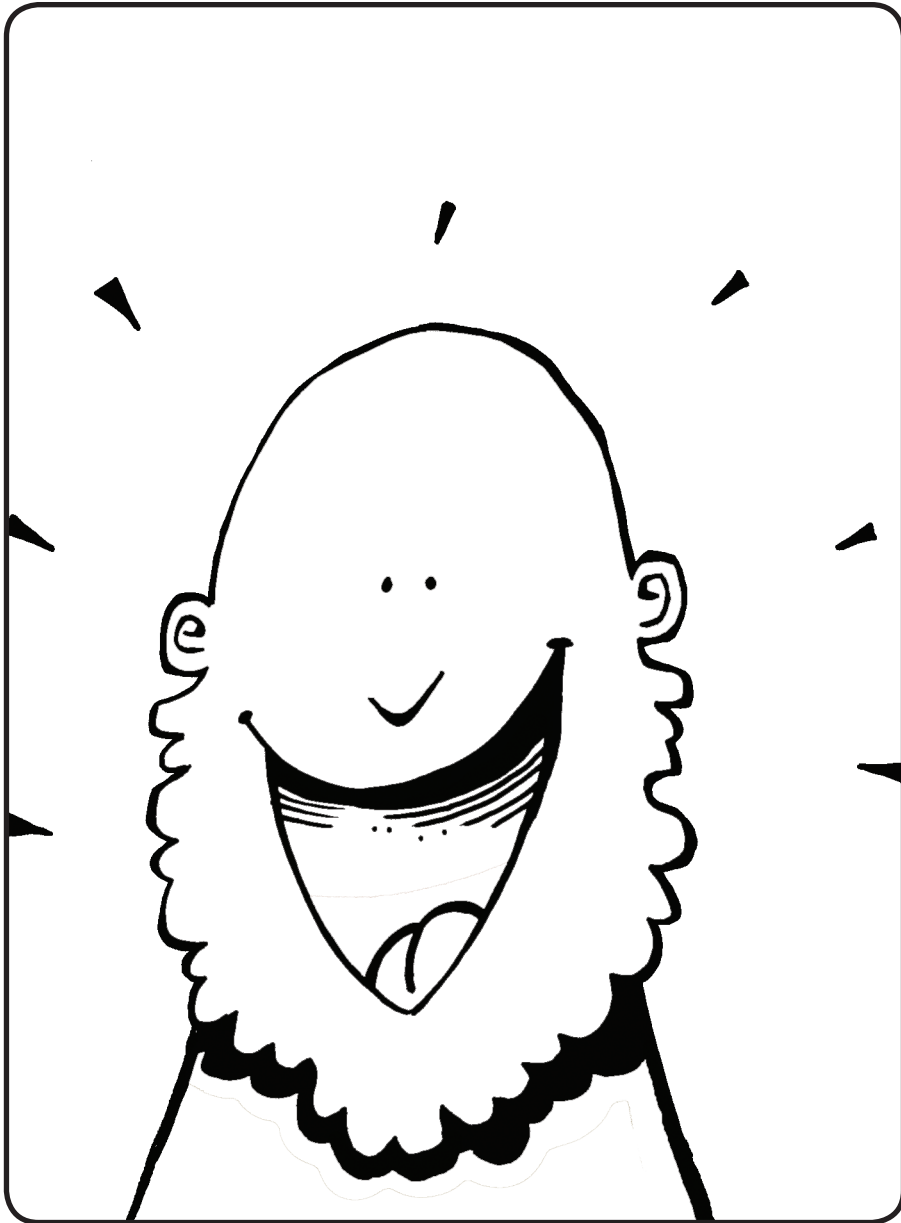
