Bidding prayer & Lord's Prayer

We give thanks for all who strive to save the earth from carelessness and destruction. Let us not be distracted by our current crisis from the work that is needed to keep our world healthy. *[brief pause]* Lord in your mercy: **hear our prayer** 

We pray for those who govern during challenging times and for all people in countries ravaged by strife, warfare or illness. For all who are most vulnerable during this pandemic: refugees, the lqbal and Alhamad/Wahid families; people living in poverty or crowded conditions, the elderly, those who already struggle with health issues. [brief pause] Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer

We pray for families challenged to live and learn in new ways. Grant patience and humor to parents and children. [brief pause] Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer

We pray for all who grieve. Give comfort and strength for the days ahead and, when the time is right, remind all who grieve of the hope we have in the resurrection. *[brief pause]* Lord in your mercy: **hear our prayer** 

We pray for those who are imprisoned and for those who care for them. [brief pause] Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer

We pray for all who call upon your healing name. Walk with all who are hungry, friendless, despairing, and those in need of healing in body and spirit especially: Elsie, Audrey, Orville and Carol, Hannah, Bruce, Gloria, Logan, William, Marcus, Bishop Gomez, Brodie, Karin, Anthony, Robert, Curtis, Linda, Marci, Gayle, Evelyn, Lisa, Danielle, Inger, Anne Jane, Deanna, Ron, Marlene, Martha, and all those we name aloud or in the silence of our hearts ......(a pause to offer time to name others).
