Second Sunday of Advent

This Advent/Christmas Season Augustana we are incorporating some resources on the theme of "From Generation to Generation" which will help to focus our Advent rituals. We also will be using an all-ages mural project, courtesy of a resource called "Way to Lead Ministries." This consists of 5 large colouring sheets, one for each Sunday in Advent, plus Christmas Eve, that when put together form a large mural which can eventually be displayed in our sanctuary. Anyone coming into the church at any time can do some colouring, but we especially encourage kids to participate in this activity—for example, during the Sunday sermon. This should be a fun and satisfying project which results in something beautiful we can all appreciate.

The Health Cabinet **Christmas Hamper Appeal** continues to **December 11**. The goal of \$1200 for grocery gift cards to needy families has been reached. Also, each Monday during Advent, the church leaders will release an ecumenical Advent meditation focused on one of the four Advent themes and will address challenges and opportunities facing the Canadian churches.
