SCRIPTURE READINGS

a reading from Genesis 24:34-38, 42-49, 58-67

Laban, Rebekah's brother, received a visitor who said, 'I am Abraham's servant. The LORD has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy; he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold, male and female slaves, camels and donkeys. And Sarah my master's wife bore a son

to my master when she was old; and he has given him all that he has. My master made me swear, saying, "You shall not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I live; but you shall go to my father's house, to my kindred, and get a wife for my son."

'I came today to the spring, and said, "O LORD, the God of my master Abraham, if now you will only make successful the way I am going! I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, 'Please give me a little water from your jar to drink,' and who will say to me, 'Drink, and I will draw for your camels also' let her be the woman whom the LORD has appointed for my master's son." 'Before I had finished speaking in my heart, there was Rebekah coming out with her water-jar on her shoulder; and she went down to the spring, and drew. I said to her, "Please let me drink." She quickly let down her jar from her shoulder, and said, "Drink, and I will also water your camels." So I drank, and she also watered the camels. Then I asked her, "Whose daughter are you?" She said, "The daughter of Bethuel, Nahor's son, whom Milcah bore to him." So I put the ring on her nose, and the bracelets on her arms. Then I bowed my head and worshipped the LORD, and blessed the LORD, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me by the right way to obtain the daughter of my master's kinsman for his son. Now then, if you will deal loyally and truly with my master, tell me; and if not, tell me, so that I may turn either to the right hand or to the left.' And they called Rebekah, and said to her, 'Will you go with this man?' She said, 'I will.' So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse along with Abraham's servant and his men. And they blessed Rebekah and said to her,

'May you, our sister, become

thousands of myriads;

may your offspring gain possession

of the gates of their foes.'

Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels, and followed the man; thus the servant took Rebekah, and went his way.

Now Isaac had come from Beer-lahai-roi, and was settled in the Negeb. Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field; and looking up, he saw camels coming. And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac, she slipped quickly from the camel, and said to the servant, 'Who is the man over there, walking in the field to meet us?' The servant said, 'It is my master.' So she took her veil and covered herself. And the servant told Isaac all the things that he had done. Then Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent. He took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her. So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.

I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me.

So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

So then, with my mind I am a slave to the law of God, but with my flesh I am a slave to the law of sin.

MEDITATION

What does it mean to be a disciple? The root word of disciple is discipline. We often think of discipline in terms of punishment, but really it means to learn. ... learning by doing.

[the root of discipleship is "discipline" not punishment <u>training</u>, <u>practice</u>, <u>exercise</u>, <u>method</u>, <u>regulation</u>, <u>drill</u>, <u>regimen</u> *inner disciplines such as meditation* **to** learn

disciple, <u>discipline</u> - Disciple comes from a Latin word meaning "learner" and discipline comes from one meaning "instruction, knowledge."

See also related terms for instruction.

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As Christians – followers of Jesus Christ -- you could say that our discipline is learn how to follow the teachings of Jesus. Jesus pointed out being a disciple (especially in any kind of leadership) is a challenge. You're too strict You're too lenient.

Sometimes it is like being stuck in the religious equivalent of Goldilocks and the Three Bears: this chair's too big ... this one too small ... this porridge is too hot This too cold This bed is too hard This one too soft. How to find the sweet spot where you are able to sit on the right size of chair to eat a good bowl of porridge before having a nap on a comfortable bed.

It seems as if discipleship, being a follower of Christ is a difficult thing .. an almost impossible task. Not only is there the criticism from others there is the criticism from ourselves. Sometimes the harshest critic of all is the voice we carry around inside ourselves— not good enough! Paul's letter to the Romans reflects this: "the good I would I don't and the evil I don't want to do I end up doing. Wretched soul that I am!"

Try as we might we still fall short of what we expect of ourselves and what we expect of others.

It is hard to continue to do what we're called on to do when we are faced with criticism: from others and from ourselves. Even when the criticism is true and warranted. Jesus' words offer some relief ... they are a centre of calm: 'Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.' Jesus offers breathing space.

I am curious about this yoke Jesus speaks of – a yoke is not something worn alone. A yoke links two animals together in order to pull a load with their combined strength … when we take on Jesus' yoke it means that we aren't working in isolation. We aren't alone.

There is be some consolation in knowing that we live and operate in a community. But there is another perspective on being yoked together. Living in what seems to be an increasingly polarized world where we seem to always be looking for someone to blame ... someone <u>else</u> to blame. How keen are we to be yoked with someone who has a different worldview ... a different way of thinking and expressing their Christian faith.

How might we handle being tied to someone with whom we have nothing in common except that we both profess to be followers of Jesus. Do we say nothing and just get on with it? Or do we rant and rail against the differences? Or is it an opportunity to practice some curiosity ... in order to learn? Perhaps. But there is a different way to view that yoke.

The yoke Jesus speaks of is a learning device. As understand it – as one who really knows nothing about working with oxen -- an experienced ox would be yoked with a young inexperienced ox. And as they worked together the young inexperienced ox learned from the ox who knew what he was doing.

I am reminded that we are hearing Jesus' words through the words of the gospel of Matthew. Matthew, who tells us that the name of the Christ child was to be Emmanuel "God with us."

"God with us" in the yoke. When Jesus offers his yoke ... offers us the opportunity to learn ... offers us rest for our soul ... it is because Jesus is the experienced partner under the yoke and we are the inexperienced ox that needs to learn how to do our job. What a relief that is.

I am not yoked to that jerk I disagree with .. that person I would like to set straight. I am yoked to Jesus who is gentle and humble of heart. I am yoked to the one who can teach me how to listen ... I am yoked to the one who can teach me how to be a faithful disciple and not a jerk. That is rest for my soul.

I would like to close with some words from John Hus a Christian from long ago whose discipleship we remember on July 6 every year:

"Therefore faithful Christian, seek the truth, listen to the truth, learn the truth, love the truth, speak the truth, adhere to truth and defend truth to the death.

And the words of Jesus from even longer ago: learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls
