





Draw what happened here.




When we keep promises, people know we mean what we say and can trust us.




Hit the Mark

Solve this puzzle to learn what Paul said:



Jesus tells his disciples to deny themselves, take up their cross, and follow him. Sometimes we have to think of God and others before ourselves.


What could you do to put God first? Write or draw about it inside this cross.

Draw a picture of your feelings here.**




