Lots of people help make church happen every Sunday. Match the church workers with what they need to do their job. In the space below, draw the job that you would like to do.







The landowner in the story paid everyone the same amount. Read these story verses to figure out what time to draw on each clock.




At church, we take time to share what we have with other people. We put the money in an offering basket or offering plate.
