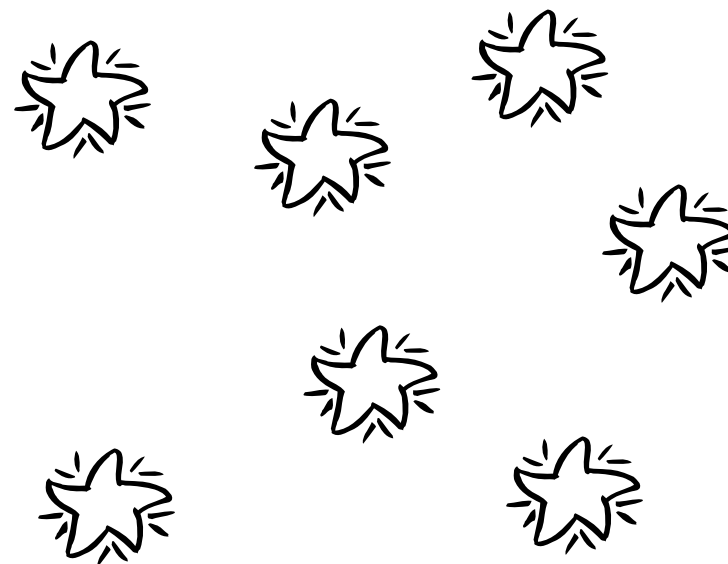
Kids Celebrate

Some people draw imaginary lines between stars in the sky to create pictures.

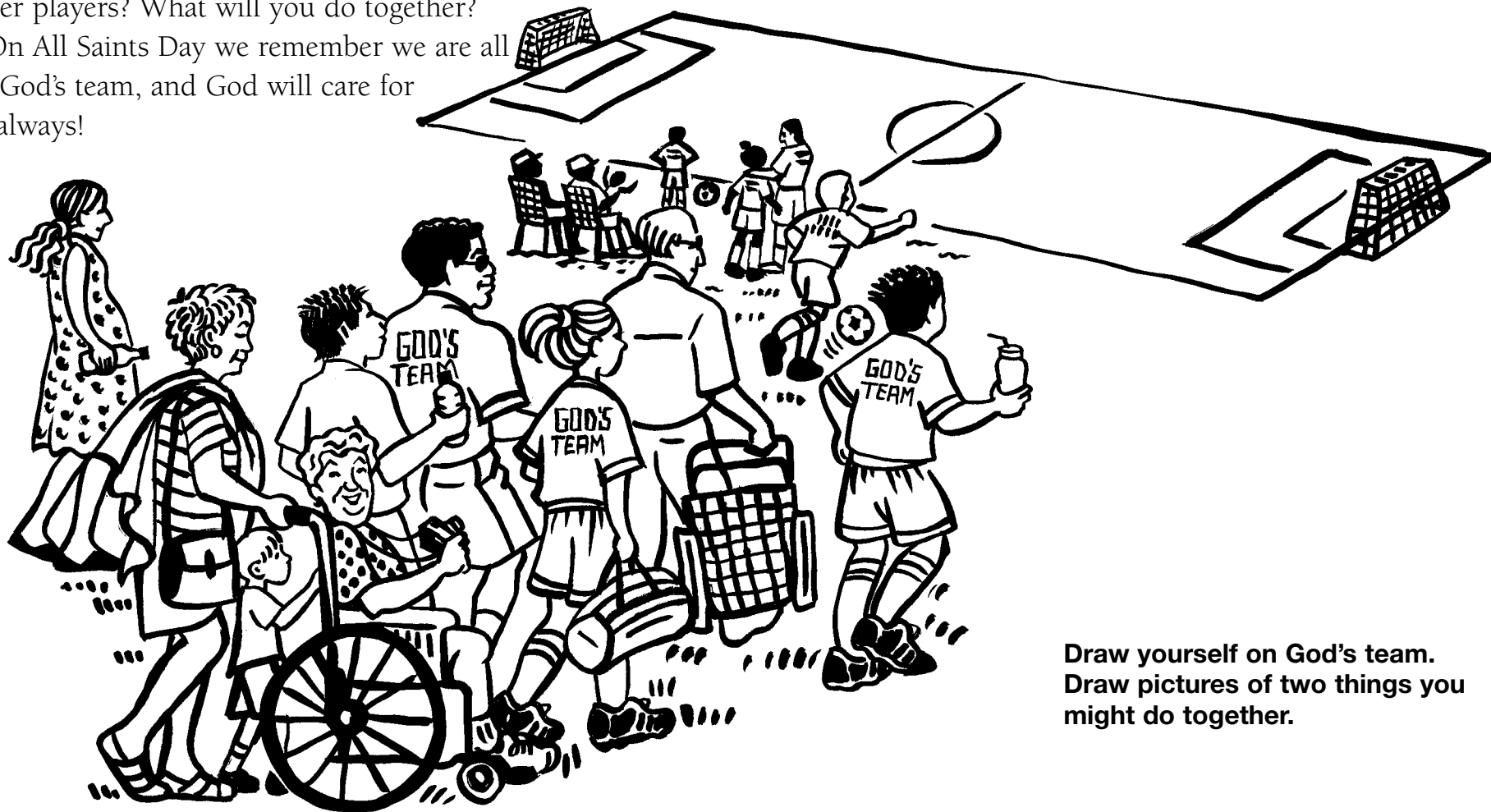
**Draw faces of God's people in these stars.

On All Saints Day we remember we are all on God's team, and God will care for us always!



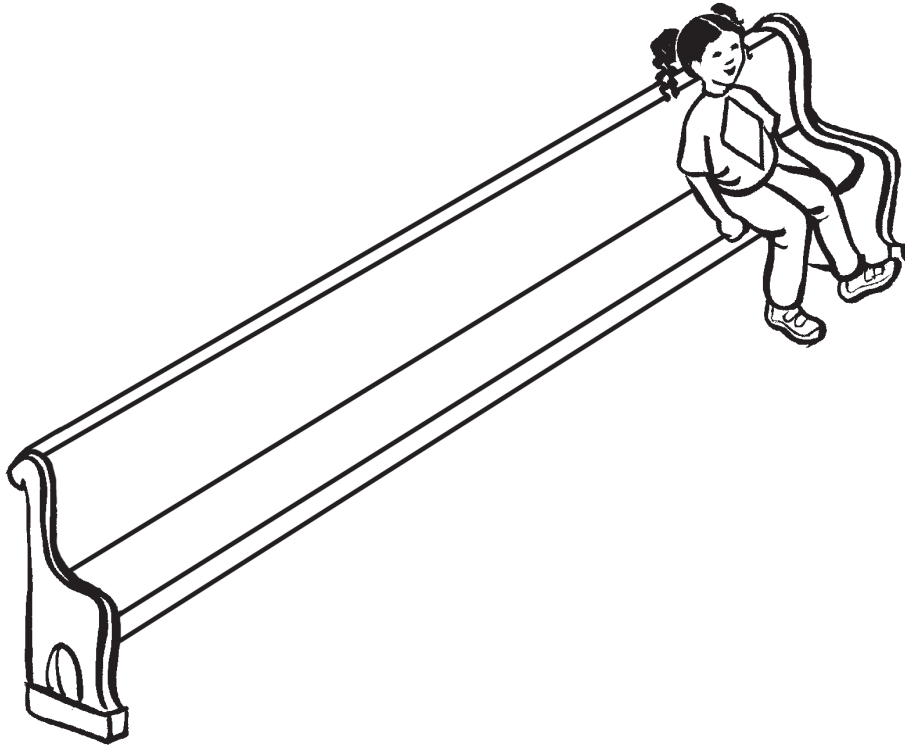

Riding the bus

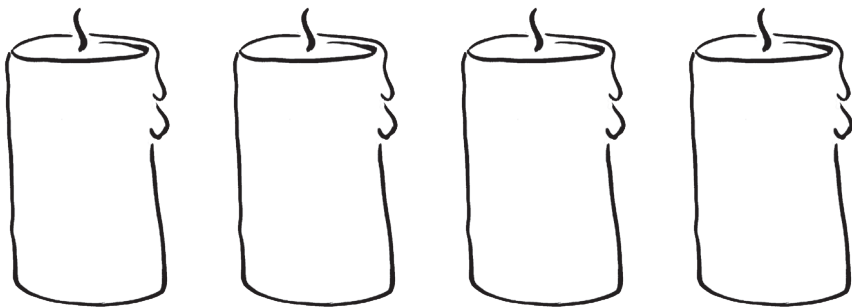
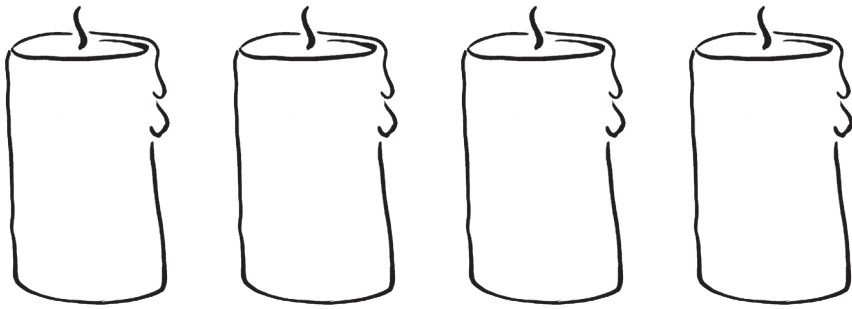
On the playground

All Saints Day

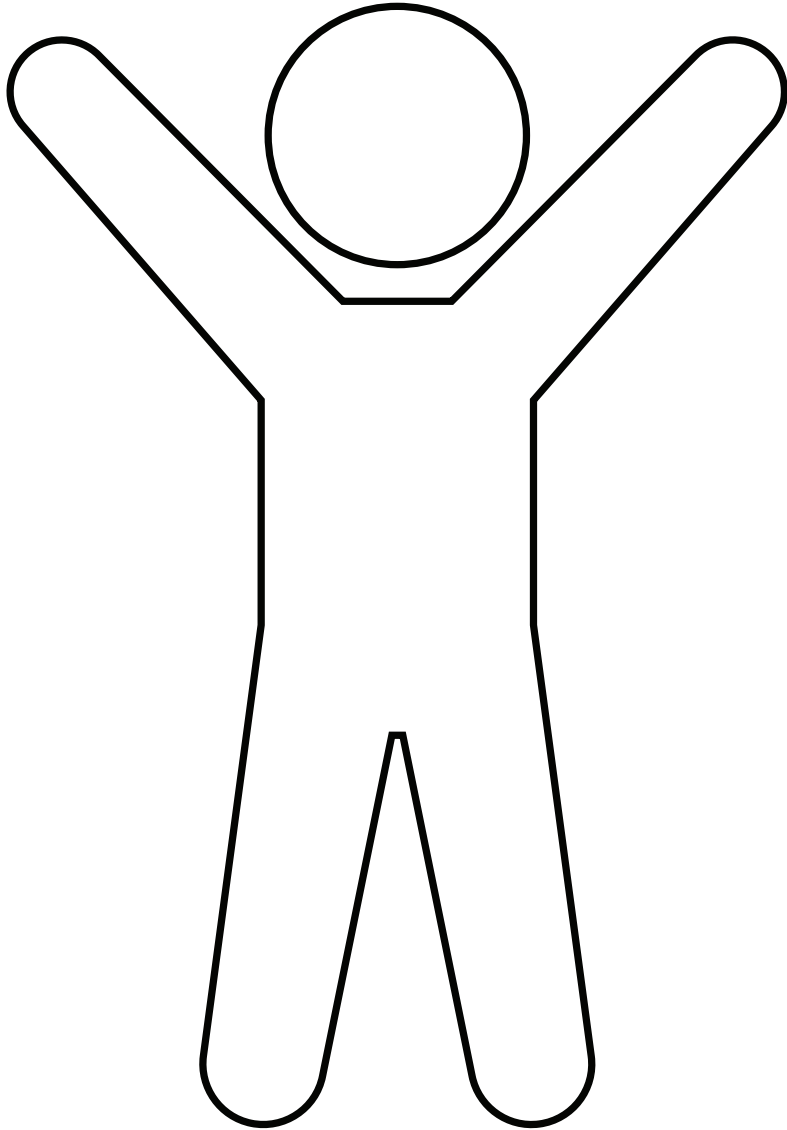
