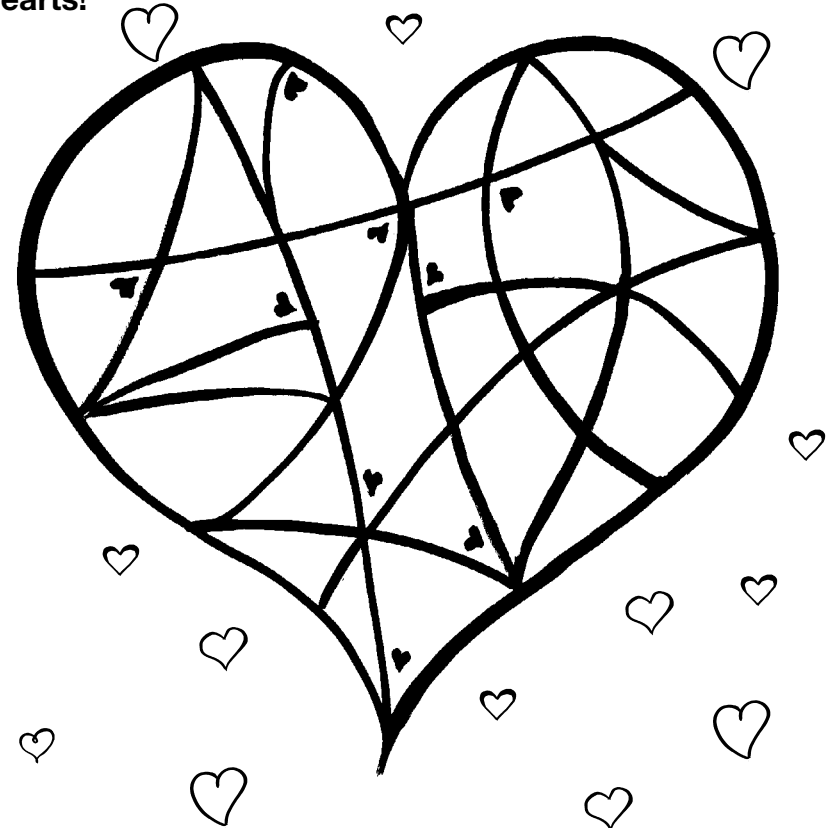

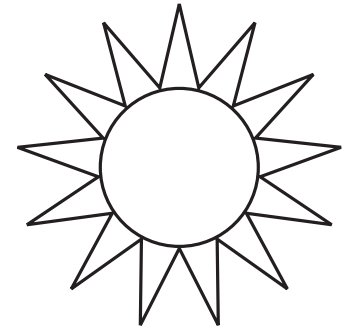
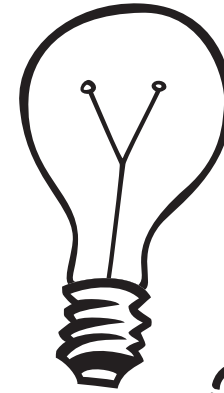

- During Lent, we think about and reflect on **Jesus' life**.













Light It Up!

Nicodemus shows up later in the Bible, too. Read John 19:38-42 to find out what Nicodemus brought to Jesus' burial.

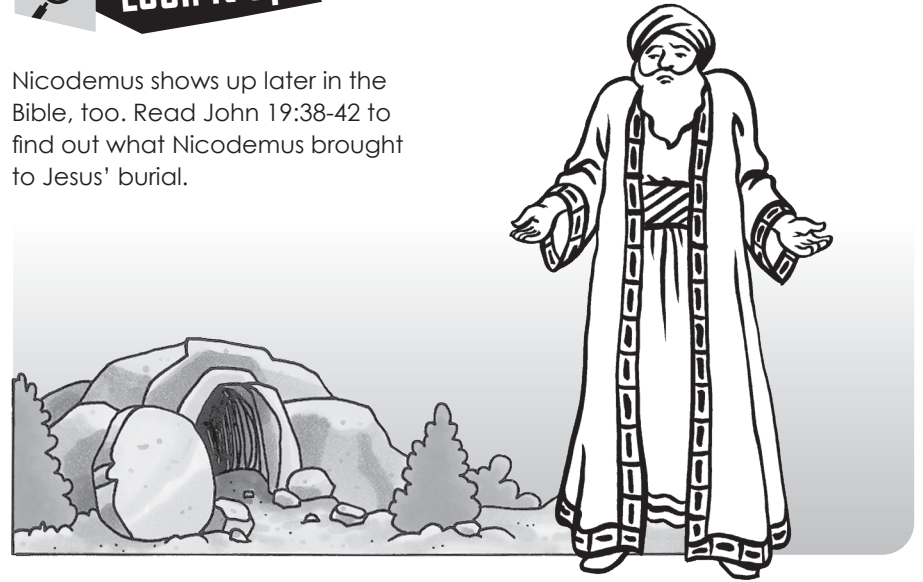
