



FALLS AND INJURIES: IT'S NOT JUST THE ICE!


With our warm winter, icy sidewalks are a falls risk that we all worry about. Falls can happen inside your home as well as outside.

Bathrooms and stairs are places in our homes where falls occur more frequently.

What can we do?

Bathroom:

- use a rubber bath math for the tub and shower, install when dry
 - wipe up any spills or moisture right away
 - install grab bars by the toilet and bath





Stairways:

- make sure your stairs are well lit
- remove reading glasses when going up or down stairs
 - never rush! take your time
 - have solid handrails on both sides of the stairs.

To generally reduce your fall risk, inside and out, have your vision and hearing checked regularly. Use walking aids if they have been recommended.

And Eat Well and Stay Fit.

A few short exercises sessions (15 minutes four times a day) provides as much benefit as one long exercise session.

CELEBRATE THE STORY OF PARISH NURSE MINISTRIES IN SASKATCHEWAN AND HELP SHAPE THE NEXT CHAPTER

From the Treasurer's Desk Karen Wallace

The past year has been a challenging one from the standpoint of our finances. Your council is well aware of steps we can take to work toward a balance budget in the future. There is a working group, composed of council members and members from the congregation, in place looking at various options we might be able to employ to address our long-term financial stability.

At our AGM, a deficit budget will be presented for your approval. We can significantly reduce the deficit at year-end by considering increasing our collective donations to Augustana. Your donations have enabled this faith community to, among many other ministries,:

- Support people in need locally and globally;
- Stay connected with members of our congregation and the broader faith community;
- Worship together, grow deeper in our faith and in our welcome to all; and
- Provide a gathering space for several community groups.

Based on 2023 giving, if each member that donates to Augustana could manage to contribute an additional 15% in 2024 our deficit budget would be eliminated. This translates into a donation of \$115 if you previously gave \$100 – or an extra \$1.25/month. The table below shows a few examples of how this increase would impact you.

Numerous families have lost loved ones, children have reverted to bed-wetting and cannot sleep alone due to fear, young people increasingly believe it is pointless to study or prepare for the future because they will not survive to see adulthood. Poverty, hunger, depression/anxiety, and domestic violence are all on the rise.

May the Holy Spirit continue to strengthen the ELCJHL and Palestinian Christian community and lead our two churches into deeper love and care for one another, for the sake of the Gospel that is good news of God's justice and care for all vulnerable and oppressed peoples, for the sake of the wholeness of the world.
