WE REMEMBER

In this meal, we remember our Brother Jesus. He was born a bright light in a dim world. He proclaimed the Kingdom of God in bold words and loving deeds. For this, he was crucified by fearful people. But he rose from the dead and ascended to the right hand of God. In the midst of this meal we set three symbols, so that we may remember:

Reader 1: A candle, to remind us that he poured out his Holy Spirit upon us, giving us life, power, and hope. We, filled with this Spirit, are signs of God's presence to the world.

Reader 2: Bread, for he is the bread of life. He nourishes us and we put our trust in him.

Reader 3: A cup, to remind us of his sufferings. He took up the cup with his friends before he was crucified and his blood flowed. He suffers still when the oppressed suffer injury at the hands of the powerful.

Let us pray:

Lord, we welcome your presence with us.

All:

May the food and companionship we share nourish our bodies, hearts and minds.

And may our spirits be refreshed as we live in the light of your presence.

With us now, and at all times and places. Amen.

WE OFFER PEACE

Our brother Jesus said: "I give you my peace." Let us share his gift among ourselves and all humanity. The peace of Jesus is with us!

In the midst of a tense and dangerous time, they found each other at table, connecting over the story of God-enfleshed among them.

And as they did so, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to God, broke the bread and shared it with his disciples saying,

"Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he also took the cup, gave thanks to God, and shared it with his disciples, saying,

"Drink from this, all of you; this is the cup of the new covenant. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."
And so we pray,

Come Holy Spirit, Breath of God, Renewer of life, be in these gifts and all who gather here,

that we might be transformed in our remembrance of your radical love,

your eternal embrace, and your grace that makes all things news.

All:

For the sake of our shared lives, the life of this land on which we live,

and the lives of those yet to come, nourish us and renew our hope

that soon Christ may rise again among us. Amen.
